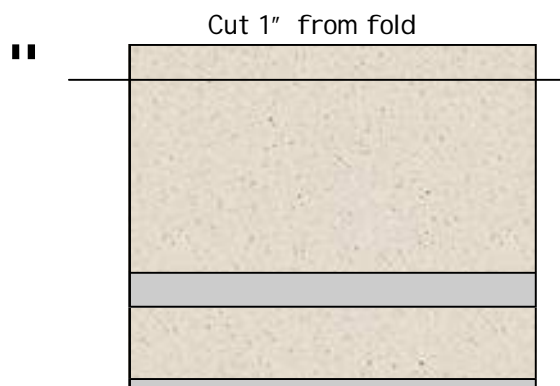


# Terry Bath Mitt

One hand towel will make two bath mitts.

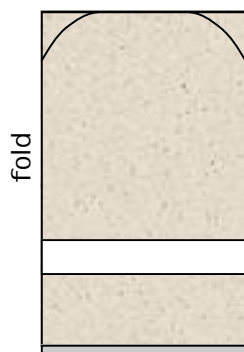
Fold the towel in half, bringing the two hems together. Cut 1" away from the fold. This will give you a 2" strip that you will later use to make hanging loops. (If the towel is particularly large, you could cut away more than an inch.)



Embellish as you wish. You could embroider a monogram or place decorative stitches on the woven band of the towel.



Fold in half, right sides together, and round off the corners opposite the hem. Tip: A saucer can be used to guide a rotary cutter around the corners.



Serge the side and bottom seam or sew the seam and finish the raw edges on a sewing machine. Turn right side out.

Make a loop with half of the 2" strip you cut from the fold. (Save the other half for the second mitt.) Fold the raw edges to meet in the center of the strip, then fold in half with the edges to the inside. Stitch the folds together along the entire strip. Make a loop and tuck the ends inside the mitt at the seamed edge. Sew through all layers to secure the loop in place. (If you prefer, you could make the loop from ribbon or cord. This is particularly a good idea if your towel is thick, making the loop too bulky to work with.)
