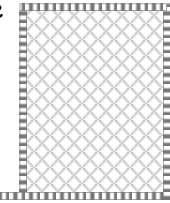


Three Pocket Scissor Holder

Supplies:

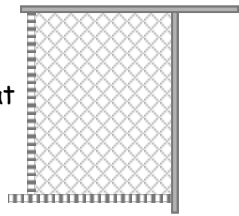
- 8" x 10 1/2" double faced quilted fabric (If you will quilt the fabric yourself, cut it larger and trim to size after quilting.)
- Serger with 3 spools serger thread to match fabric
- BERNINA Bias Binder
- Bias strip of coordinating fabric, about 30" long (width to fit binder)
- BERNINA #10 or #10C foot
- Thread to match fabric

1. Finish all 4 sides of the quilted fabric with the serger and a **narrow** 3 thread overlock. (Two sides will later be covered with bias binding, so you may skip the serging on those sides, if you wish. However, you may find it easier to bind the edges if they are compressed by the serging.)



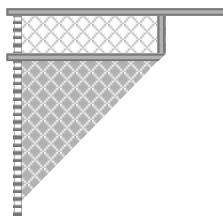
2. Leave a thread tail on the lower left hand corner, but trim the tails on the other 3 corners.

3. Bind the right hand side. Trim the binding at the top edge, but leave a short tail at the bottom edge.

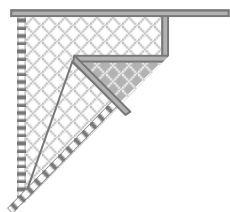


4. Bind the top side and continue off the edge of the fabric to give yourself a bias tape tail between 3" and 4" long, or however long you wish to make the loop for hanging.

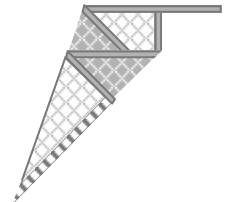
5. Fold the shorter serged edge up to align with the longer serged edge, forming a diagonal fold. Press the fold.



6. Bring the shorter serged edge back to align with the fold. Press well.



7. Bring the longer serged edge inside, tight into the fold. Press. Tuck the thread tail inside the fold, and fold the short binding tail under.



8. Using Edgestitch Foot #10 or #10C, straight stitch along the two sides of the holder to secure the folded fabric.

9. Bring the end of the long bias tail back to the top corner and stitch in place.
